Force Majeure Notification Letter for Consent Decree Appendix D-2, Capital Improvement Project 4.4 - North Dade 72 inch PCCP Force Main Rehabilitation

## Dear Sir/Madam:

In accordance with the provisions of Section XI, Paragraph 52 of the above referenced Consent Decree, Miami-Dade orally notified EPA and FDEP on October 28, 2015 of a potential delay of CD Appendix D-2 Capital Improvement Project (CIP) 4.4 - North Dade 72 inch Pre-stressed Concrete Cylinder Pipe (PCCP) Force Main Rehabilitation. In the progress of ongoing rehabilitation work, the seventy-two (72) inch PCCP force main was scheduled for shutdown by November 2, 2015. The shutdown, however, could not be coordinated due to a contractor caused break of another 72 inch transmission force main at SW 147<sup>th</sup> Terrace and 77<sup>th</sup> Avenue that occurred on October 21, 2015.

The critical repair of the damaged 72 inch force main and the scheduled shutdown of the CIP 4.4 72 inch force main could not be performed simultaneously. When the constructability of CIP 4.4 was evaluated using the Wastewater Collection and Transmission System (WTCS) hydraulic model, the effects of the closure of the line created significant pressure increases. Figure 1 attached depicts normal flow paths throughout the WCTS. If WASD proceeded with the shutdown to perform the rehabilitation of CIP 4.4 72 inch force main while the emergency repair on the South Dade damaged 72 inch force main is being performed it would have impacted the overall system redundancy by increasing pressures throughout the system. In addition, it would have limited the flow relief to the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (SD WWTP), Central District WWTP and North District WWTP especially in the event of another emergency or a large rain event. Please see Figure 2.

It is anticipated that the emergency repair on the damaged 72 inch force main leading to SDWWTP will take one to two weeks to complete and consequently delay the CIP 4.4 construction schedule by approximately 2 weeks. We believe that the emergency repair on the damaged 72 inch force main leading to SDWWTP requiring the suspension of the scheduled shutdown on CIP 4.4 - North Dade 72 inch PCCP force main qualifies as a potential force majeure event, as the cause of this event is beyond the control of Miami-Dade, and the project could be delayed despite Miami-Dade's best efforts to complete the project according to the Consent Decree compliance schedule.

We will provide you with an update on this project once we have received the updated construction schedule reflecting the delay as a result of the emergency repair on the 72 inch force main leading to SDWWTP and the impact on the CD construction completion compliance date.
