Dear Sir/Madam:

In accordance with the provisions of Section XI, Paragraph 52 of the above referenced Consent Decree (CD), on November 7, 2020, Miami-Dade County (County) electronically notified the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) of a Potential Force Majeure of CD Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs) in Construction due to Tropical Storm Eta.

In accordance with Section XI, Paragraph 52, this update letter shall further describe and explain the reasons for the delay; the anticipated duration of the delay; all actions taken or to be taken to prevent or minimize the delay; a schedule for implementation of any measures to be taken to prevent or mitigate the delay or the effect of the delay; County's rationale for attributing such delay to a force majeure event if it intends to assert such a claim; a statement as to whether, in the opinion of the County, such event may cause or contribute to an endangerment to public health or the environment, and documentation to support the force majeure claim.

**Explanation and description of the reasons for the delay**

The County's Water and Sewer Department (WASD) and their contractors have hurricane preparedness guidelines designed to maximize the safety of the public, employees and mitigate potential damages cause by hurricanes/tropical storms. Due to the threat of Tropical Storm Eta, the Contractors were requested to secure the construction sites to protect life and property by November 6, 2020. On November 7, 2020, the County issued a Tropical Storm Warning and Flood Watch and declared a Local State of Emergency. Tropical Storm Eta caused some delays affecting CD projects in construction at the three regional WWTP's, force mains, and pump station projects as all construction activities were suspended through November 10, 2020.

**Action taken or to be taken to prevent or minimize the delay**

The County believes that the implementation of these preparation activities, were appropriate to ensure safety and prevent damage to life and property. Contractors returned to their respective construction sites on November 11, 2020.

**Anticipated duration of the delay**

The delay being requested are directly associated with the preventative measures taken for site preparation activities and Tropical Storm Eta. The delay starts from the time the County issued the directive to secure the sites on November 6, 2020, through Tropical Storm Eta, and up to November 11, 2020 when normal construction activities were resumed. Given these conditions, the County requests EPA and FDEP grant the County a 5-day time extension for all Consent Decree projects actively in construction (refer to Attachment A) affected by the need for site preparations and the tropical storm.


**Cause or contribution to an endangerment to public health, welfare, or the environment.**

### SUMMARY OF CURRENT SITUATION AND ACTIONS

1. The Miami-Dade EOC is activated to a Level 2 mobilizing key agencies and resources in response to TS Eta.
2. On the forecast track, the center of Eta will approach south Florida Sunday evening or early Monday.
3. Miami-Dade County is under a Tropical Storm Warning and a Flood Watch.
4. Mayor Carlos Gimenez has issued a Local State of Emergency for TS Eta.
5. Weather forecast, today: A chance of showers, then showers likely and possibly a thunderstorm after 1pm. Mostly cloudy, with a high near 83. Windy, with an east wind around 23 mph, with gusts as high as 30 mph. Chance of precipitation is 70%. New rainfall amounts between a quarter and half of an inch possible.
6. Weather forecast, tonight: Showers likely and possibly a thunderstorm. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 75. Windy, with an east wind around 24 mph, with gusts as high as 31 mph. Chance of precipitation is 70%. New rainfall amounts between a half and three quarters of an inch possible.
7. Mayor Carlos Gimenez conducted a press briefing at 11:00 AM.
8. The Fuchs Pavilion at Tamiami Park is scheduled to open at 2:00 PM as a shelter for residents of low lying areas, unsafe structures, or mobile homes.
9. County resources are on standby, prepared to take action to mitigate flooding and debris removal.
10. FPL Incident management teams are active. They are repositioning restoration resources today and tomorrow in order to begin restoration work as quickly as possible. They have staging sites identified throughout Miami Dade County. Currently, they have secured 10,000 response personnel and are acquiring additional resources.

**MIAMI-DADE COUNTY DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, section 252.38(3)(a), Florida Statutes, grants authority to political subdivisions to declare and enact a State of Local Emergency for a period of up to seven days, thereby waiving the procedures and formalities otherwise required of the political subdivision by law; and

WHEREAS, chapter 8B of the Code of Miami-Dade County grants the County Mayor the authority to declare a Local State of Emergency and authorizes the County Mayor to issue executive orders and to take various actions to address such emergency; and

WHEREAS, as of 11:00 AM on November 6, 2020, the National Hurricane Center reported that Tropical Storm Eta has maximum sustained winds of 35 mph and that the progress of Tropical Storm Eta may require that Tropical Storm or Hurricane watches for South Florida be issued later in the day on November 6, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Tropical Storm Eta is expected to impact Miami-Dade County and create weather conditions that may require extraordinary and immediate actions by Miami-Dade County in order to protect the public health, safety, and general welfare of the community,

THEREFORE, as County Mayor of Miami-Dade County, I hereby declare a Local State of Emergency commencing effective 8:00 AM on Saturday November 7, 2020, that will continue for seven days or if cancelled before that period of time. This Local State of Emergency includes all of Miami-Dade County, both incorporated and unincorporated areas.

Pursuant to this Declaration, further orders may be issued to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community. Such orders specifically include, but are not limited to, orders related to the items listed in 1.a-m attached. The Deputy Mayors, through the Director of the Office of Emergency Management, are hereby ordered to take whatever prudent actions are necessary to effectuate such orders and to otherwise protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community.



### Miami-Dade County Declaration of Local State of Emergency

#### **Action Options for State of Local Emergency**

1. Executive Orders of the Mayor to include:
  - a) Employee Recall order: An order recalling Miami-Dade County employees from vacation, canceling days off, and mobilizing all personnel required for disaster response;
  - b) Authorize the Internal Services Department to suspend normal leasing and bid procedures to procure space, structures or other items under their normal authority for disaster response determined necessary by the Director;
  - c) Authorize procurement of supplies, equipment, and services without formal bidding procedures;
  - d) Evacuation Order: A mandatory order(s) directing the evacuation of appropriate area(s) of the County deemed to be in imminent danger from disaster;
  - e) Curfew: In the period before, or during and immediately after an event, an order imposing a general curfew applicable to the County as a whole, or to geographical area(s) of the County and during hours the Mayor deems necessary, and from time to time, to modify the hours the curfew will be in effect and what area(s) it applies to;
  - f) An order requiring any and all commercial establishments located in area(s) of imminent or actual danger to close and remain closed until further order;
  - g) An order requiring the closure of any or all bars, taverns, liquor stores, and other business establishments where alcoholic beverages are predominantly sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sales of alcoholic beverages, and in which such alcoholic beverages may be removed or made secure from seizure by the public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other than alcoholic beverages may, at the discretion of the Mayor, be allowed to remain open;
  - h) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of alcoholic beverages in any or all parts of Miami-Dade County;
  - i) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of gasoline or other liquid flammable or combustible products in any container other than a gasoline tank properly attached to a gas powered vehicle;

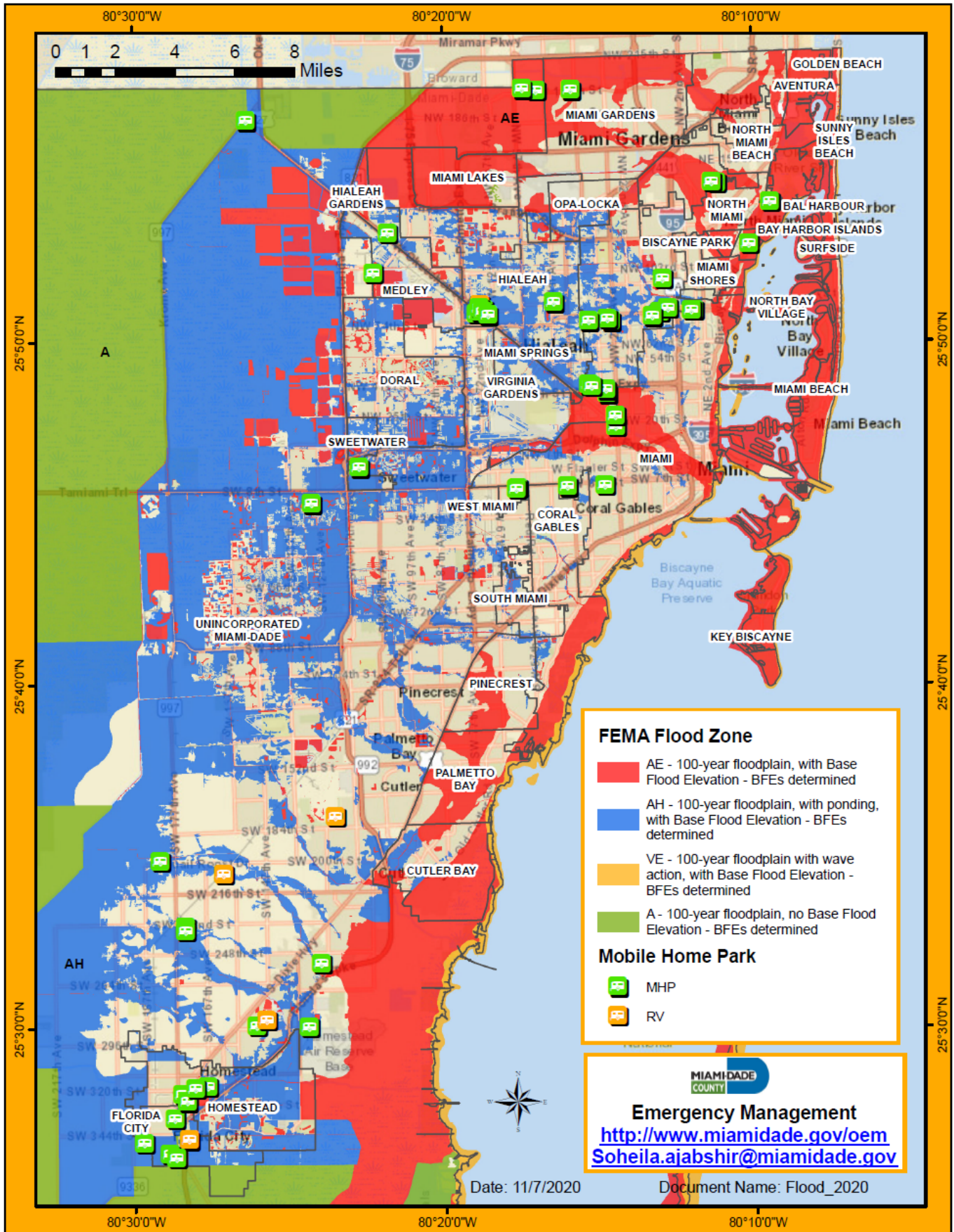

- j) An order closing to the public any or all public places including streets, alleys, public ways, schools, parks, beaches, amusement areas and public buildings;
- k) In addition to the provisions of section 8A-5 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, orders to prevent price gouging for any essential commodity, dwelling unit, or storage facility;
- l) Orders requesting the conservation of water supplies; and
- m) Such other orders as are immediately necessary for the protection of life and property; provided, however, that any such orders shall, at the earliest practicable time, be presented to the Board for ratification or confirmation in accordance with this chapter.

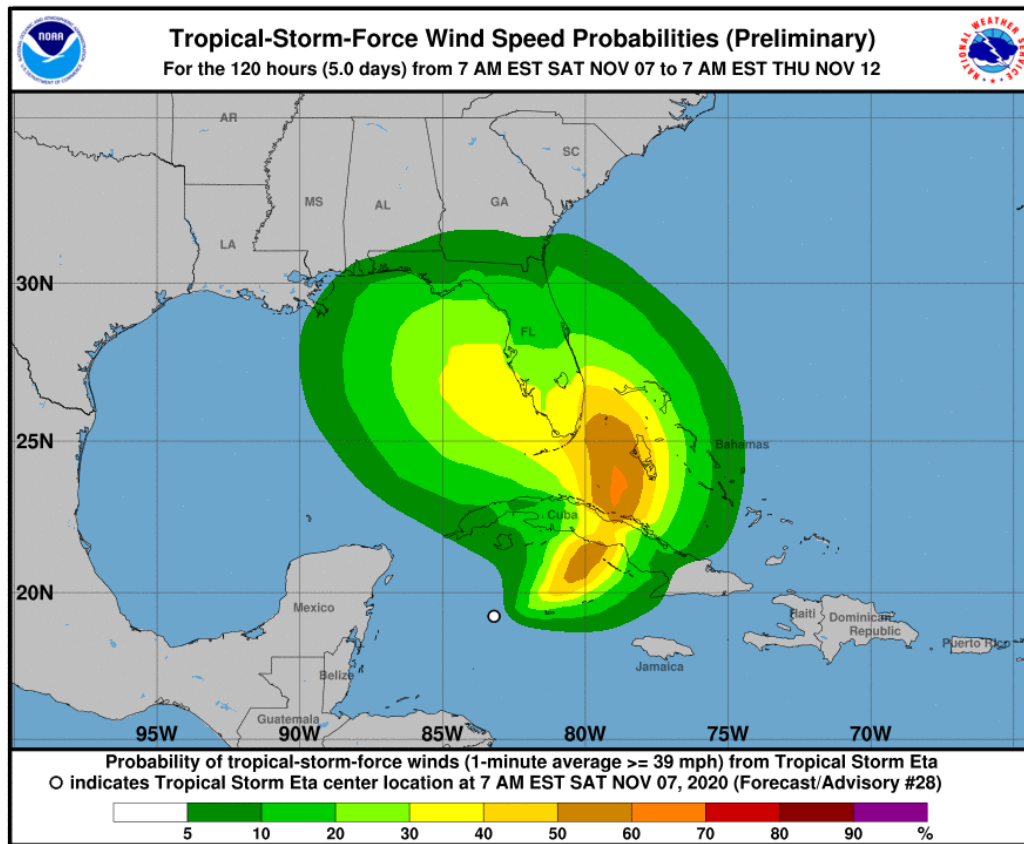

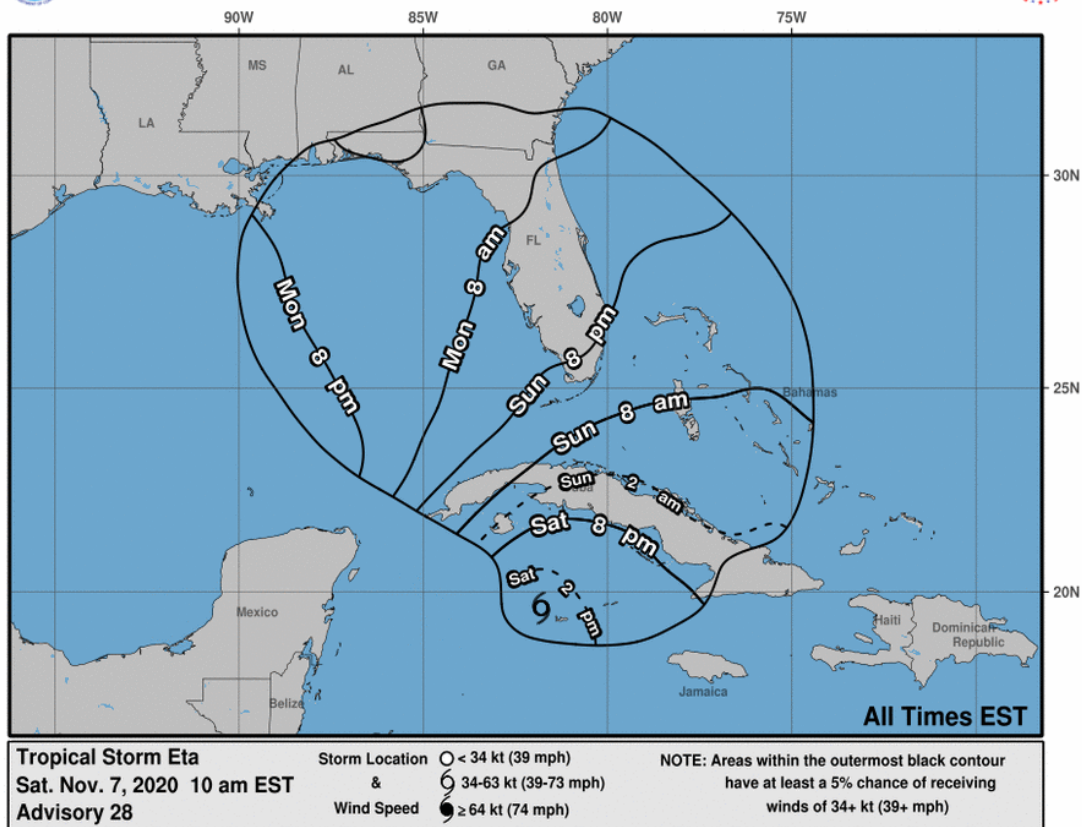

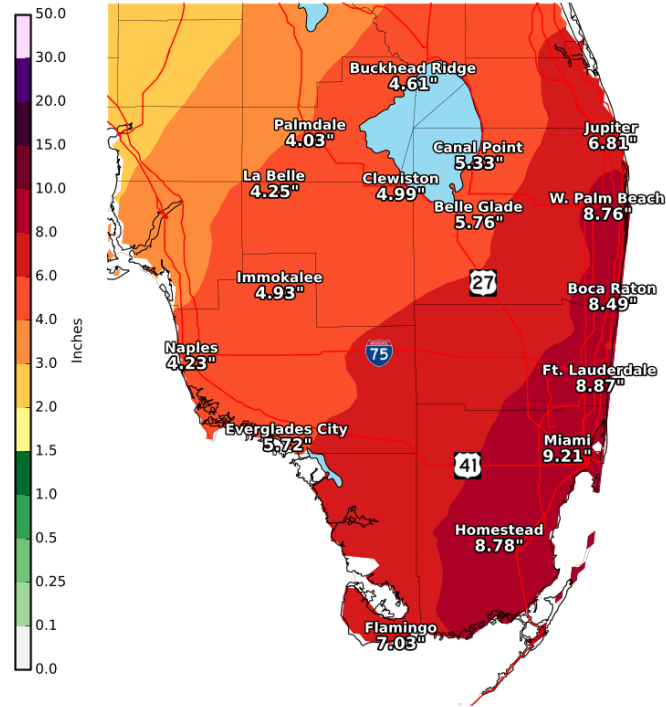
## Earliest Reasonable Arrival Time of Tropical-Storm-Force Winds

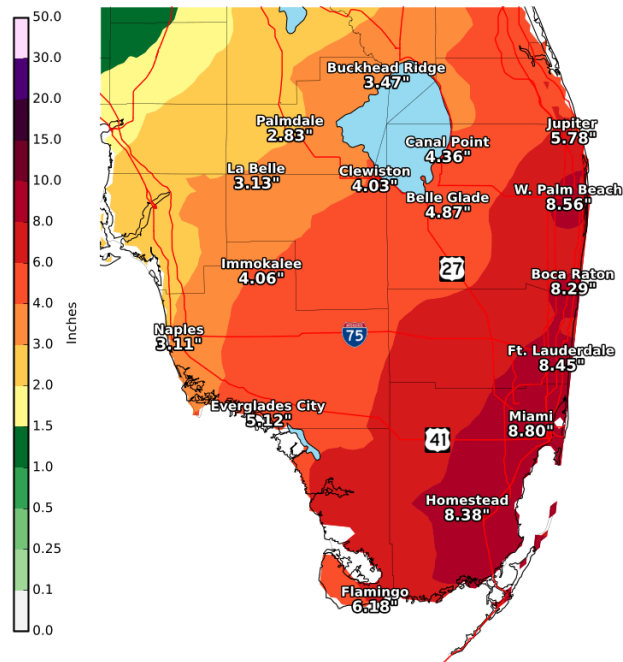


